

## **STUDENT RISK SCREENING SCALE (SRSS)**

### **Description from Lane et. al., 2009**

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The SRSS (Drummond, 1994) is a psychometrically sound, seven-item mass screening tool used to identify elementary students who are at risk for antisocial behavior patterns.

Teachers rate each student on seven items— steals; lies, cheats, sneaks; behavior problems; peer rejection; low achievement; negative attitude; and aggressive behavior—using a 4-point, Likert-type scale ranging from 0 to 3 (0 = never, 1 = occasionally, 2 = sometimes, 3 = frequently).

Total scores range from 0 to 21, forming three risk categories: low (0 to 3), moderate (4 to 8), or high risk (9 or higher).
